AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to establishing the department of civilian justice

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The executive law is amended by adding a new article 28 to read as follows:

ARTICLE 28

DEPARTMENT OF CIVILIAN JUSTICE

Section 821. Department of civilian justice; establishment and composition.

822. Department of civilian justice; functions and duties.

§ 821. Department of civilian justice; establishment and composition. is hereby established a department of civilian justice. The head of the department of civilian justice shall be the commissioner of civilian justice, to be appointed by the governor. The department of 12 civilian justice shall have a deputy commissioner to be appointed by the 13 governor. The department of civilian justice shall have a director of 14 investigations to be appointed by the governor. The director of investigations shall hire and supervise a unit of five investigative supervisors, and no less than fifty investigative staff. The department of civilian justice shall have a director of operations and human resources to be appointed by the governor. The department of civilian justice shall have a director of trials and judicial operations, who shall be a judge, to be appointed by the governor. The director of trials and judicial operations shall hire and supervise a unit of five administrative law judges, ten prosecutors, and six court reporters. Adjudicatory 23 proceedings of the department of civilian justice shall be conducted by administrative law judges who are not affiliated with nor influenced by 25 any state department. 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1 justice shall be conducted in an impartial fashion by an investigative staff composed of civilian employees.

§ 822. Department of civilian justice; functions and duties. The

department of civilian justice shall have the following duties and
responsibilities:

1. promulgate rules and regulations in accordance with the state administrative procedure act regarding corruption and misconduct by a person in a public safety position, including any position or rank within any police department, district attorney's office, fire department, county jail or correctional facility and the New York state department of corrections and community supervision;

 2. receive, review and investigate complaints made by any person, whether or not that person is a victim of, or witness to, an incident of corruption or misconduct by a person in a public safety position, including any position or rank within any police department, district attorney's office, fire department, county jail or correctional facility and the New York state department of corrections and community supervision. Intake of complaints shall be taken by phone, mail and through the department of civilian justice website;
- 3. conduct adjudicatory proceedings in accordance with the state administrative procedure act, and issue final decisions, which may include discipline for any position or rank within any police department, district attorney's office, fire department, county jail or correctional facility and the New York state department of corrections and community supervision;
- 4. secure subpoenas, as needed, to retrieve evidence and conduct a thorough investigation of complaints received by the department of civilian justice;
- 5. review all records, files, and computers obtained by the department of civilian justice of any person under investigation by the department of civilian justice;
- 6. suspend any person or persons found guilty of obstructing an investigation of the department of civilian justice in an adjudicatory proceeding conducted pursuant to the state administrative procedure act. Such person or persons shall be further charged with misconduct and corruption in an adjudicatory proceeding conducted pursuant to the state administrative procedure act;
- 7. suspend any person or persons found guilty of causing retaliation against a person for filing a complaint with the department of civilian justice in an adjudicatory proceeding conducted pursuant to the state administrative procedure act. Such person or persons shall be further charged with misconduct and corruption in an adjudicatory proceeding conducted pursuant to the state administrative procedure act;
- 8. provide an annual report of the commissioner of civilian justice in a public hearing;
- 9. comply with the provisions of the freedom of information law, including directly handling all requests for information pursuant to the freedom of information law; and
- 10. engage in community outreach throughout the state to educate the public concerning the department of civilian justice's purpose and the services provided to the public concerning the issues relevant to the department of civilian justice's operation.
- \$ 2. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall have become a law.
